

ACME 2025 REPORT

Accreditation Commission for Midwifery Education
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The ACME Board of Review, the decision-making body for ACME held two decision-making sessions in 2025. One session was a 2-part session. The results are as follows:

Session I

Continued Accreditation • Case Western Reserve University was granted a 10-year accreditation, expiring 2/28/2035. • Frontier Nursing University was granted a 10-year accreditation, expiring 2/28/2035. • Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey was granted a 10-year accreditation, expiring 2/28/2035.

Initial Accreditation • University of Arizona at Tucson College of Nursing was granted a 5-year initial accreditation, expiring 2/28/2030. • University of Tennessee Health Science Center was granted a 5-year initial accreditation, expiring 2/28/2030.

Preaccreditation • Boston College was granted a 5-year preaccreditation, expiring 2/28/2030. • University of South Carolina was granted a 5-year preaccreditation, expiring 2/28/2030.

Session II (Part A & Part B)

Preaccreditation • Granted a 5-year preaccreditation to the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, (expires 7/31/2030).

Continued Accreditation • Thomas Jefferson University was granted a 10-year accreditation that will expire 7/31/2035. • Shenandoah University was granted a 10-year accreditation that will expire 7/31/2035.

Initial Accreditation • Granted a 5-year initial accreditation to the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Nursing, Nurse-Midwifery Pathway (expires June 30, 2030).

Preaccreditation • Granted a 5-year preaccreditation to the University of Arizona College of Health Sciences Master of Science in Midwifery Program (expires June 30, 2030).
